

# Interior Design Certificate Program | Foundation Level

The Certificate of Interior Design consists of 18 classes (82 units) and is designed to provide beginners with a fundamental education in the field of interior architecture. The Certificate Program is the only one in the nation leading to a Master of Interior Architecture degree that is offered on a continuing education basis.

The Certificate Program is open enrollment and students may begin during any quarter of the year. Course scheduling may vary and does not guarantee completion within 1 ½ years. All required courses must be taken “For Credit-Letter Grade.” A minimum GPA of 2.0 is required to earn the Certificate. The Master’s Program requires a minimum 3.0 GPA in the Foundation Level. Establishing Candidacy is required for all Certificate students. Domestic students may take up to five courses before establishing Candidacy; International students must establish Candidacy during the I-20 process. The Arc+ID Candidacy Fee is \$250, non-refundable and non-transferable. Candidate students have exclusive access to various resources and benefits. Students who successfully complete the Certificate Program with a minimum 3.0 GPA and have a 4-year bachelor’s degree with a minimum 3.0 GPA are eligible to apply for the Master’s Program. F-1 visa students must take a minimum of 12 units per quarter and must adhere to all requirements outlined by the International Student Office.

# Master of Interior Architecture Program | Advanced Level

The primary goal of the Master of Interior Architecture program is to provide an opportunity for individuals with a minimum of a bachelor's degree to pursue a rigorous program that prepares them to enter the field of interior design incorporating the highest standards of professional practice. The curriculum for the MIA degree program requires the completion of 63 quarter units (42 semester units).
